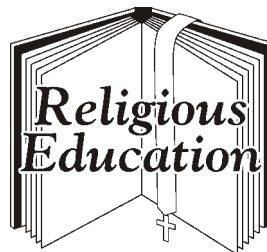

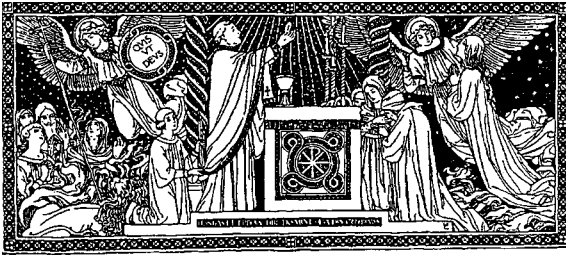
grade class in Eucharistic celebration. After Mass, everyone is welcome to come to the cafeteria, where Grade Five is providing light refreshments and a display of art.

## Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There are only two more Sundays left in the church year - where did the time go? At this time last year, we were immersed in the renewal of our Communion Rite, using a new procession path to the altar and remembering to make a small, reverent bow before responding AMEN and receiving the host. We had started to use a *Lamb of God* setting that we could adjust to fit the action during the Fraction Rite, and we had learned to begin both the communion procession and the communion song while the priest was communicating himself - but we hadn't yet added the chalices of Precious Blood to our reception of the Sacrament. Now *all* of those adjustments have become a natural part of our worship!

Did you attend the All Souls' Day Mass of Remembrance last Tuesday evening? If you did, you had an introduction to the talents of Mr. Iouri Grichetchkine, our Director of Music/Organist. Iouri will be joining us at weekend liturgies in two short weeks, to celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, the end of the church year. He has already begun to plan and prepare so that our Adult Choir can begin its weekly rehearsals and be ready not only for our Thanksgiving Day Mass, but for Advent and Christmas as well. Our Adult Choir members have already received a newsletter; if you would like to join them in time for Christmas, please watch the bulletin for the announcement of the first rehearsal.

Next Sunday, November 14<sup>th</sup>, we will have the opportunity to gather in the atrium after every Sunday morning Mass for our *Coffee and...* time of fellowship. Our gatherings will be bittersweet, however, since it is also the weekend to bid farewell to Deacon Jack Gimblett and to thank him for his years of service to our parish family. Please be sure to wish him well as he moves forward on the path God has chosen for him. Please keep him and his family in your prayers, and remember to pray, also, for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate, and the religious life.

You can see below that we are already thinking about the upcoming Advent season! Please consider how *you* will prepare for the coming of the Lord. Will you be ready spiritually? Our Nativity narrative study and our weekly Eucharistic Adoration, together with other Advent events that will be shown in the bulletin in the coming weeks, can help - if you let them!

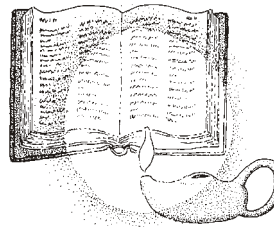

The person of Jesus is truly present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - in the Eucharist. 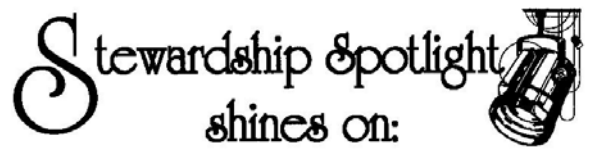
**CHEERLEADERS:** Last Saturday the girls competed in the NJ Qualifiers at Sovereign Arena in Trenton, doing an outstanding job.
