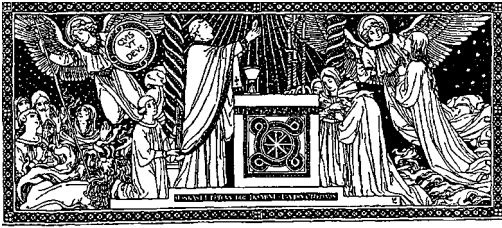

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

October 4th is the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, one of God's great stewards. He turned himself around from being a rich and frivolous young man to living a very simple and seemingly "poor" lifestyle in service to God through service to others - and by doing so, astounded and inspired the Church. His devotion and loyalty to the Church were absolute and a strong example to follow at a time when various movements of reform tended to break the Church's unity. Because he lived a simple life in the woods, St. Francis is often associated with animals, and in 1980 Pope John Paul II proclaimed St. Francis the patron saint of ecologists.

In honor of St. Francis, the Blessing of Animals will take place this Sunday afternoon at 2 PM in the plaza in front of our church. All parishioners are invited to bring their pets for this special blessing. VII. SCHOOL CHOICE AND PUBLIC EDUCATION: WHY SHOULDN'T THEY BE PERFECT TOGETHER?

Seventh in a series highlighting the position of the New Jersey School Choice Alliance) on school choice.

The taxpayers of New Jersey currently spend an average of over \$11,000 per student to educate children in our state's public schools. Critics of school choice use the facile argument that public education will be harmed by any school choice plan. Nothing could be further from the truth. The Catholic Bishops support full funding for public education in order to provide effective schools which are accountable to the taxpayers. The unanswered question always remains: What constitutes full funding? No public school officials ever seem to answer that question. However, current and proposed school choice programs provide models of funding for public education which would not penalize public schools for the loss of students under school choice. For example, if aid to public education were provided in the form of \$10,000 per student and a scholarship of up to \$5,000 would be awarded to students selecting school choice schools, the remaining \$5,000 would still be given to the district to increase the funding for those students who did not exercise school choice. In effect, public schools would be receiving money for children that they did not teach.

Even more revealing is the fact that public schools improve dramatically with only the threat of school choice on the horizon. A 2003 study by Jay Greene and Marcus Winters concluded that: "Florida's low performing public schools are improving in direct proportion to the challenge they face from voucher competition." In Milwaukee, the student dropout rate declined and real per-pupil spending increased dramatically. The number of teachers in the Milwaukee public schools also increased after the implementation of school choice.

Although the federal No Child Left Behind Act currently contains no provisions for parents to exercise nonpublic school choice, the possibility of public school choice has caused districts throughout the nation to focus attention on those schools which are designated as "failing" or "unsafe" with respect to the definitions established by the federal law. Thus, the specter of school choice has created the real or implied possibility of competition, which makes all schools better. If real world monopolies create poorer products as a higher cost, is not the same model true for education?

We, the undersigned, are taxpayers and residents of New Jersey. We believe that all children are entitled to a government-funded education through grade 12, regardless of race, creed, color, disability, economic status, or address.

We believe that it is parents who are best suited to determine the most effective option for educating their children, and that funding for education should follow children to the school of their parents' choice.

We believe that it is the quality of instruction, not just the quantity of money spent, that guarantees a thorough and efficient education for every child.

Therefore, we request that you, our legislative representatives adopt a parental school choice program that offers viable options for students to attend traditional public schools, charter schools, nonpublic schools, or home schools, according to their needs.
